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New Arts School Program Coming to Scarborough!

After 5 years of tireless advocacy, I am proud to share that we have been successful in getting a new arts-focused high school central student interest program in Scarborough. After years of articulating the reality that Scarborough continues to be underserved compared to other parts of the city, a new program will be opened at Woburn CI.

The program will be open to all residents, not just those within the catchment area. Woburn was chosen as the site for the program for several reasons including, being relatively central, having space, and geographic accessibility. Woburn will provide a closer option for students that would otherwise have to travel to Wexford CI (the only other arts focused central student interest program in Scarborough).

The new Arts programs will be implemented for Grade 9 in September 2024.

Appointment to Toronto Board of Public Health

It is with great privilege that I share that I have been elected by my fellow trustees to serve as the Education Representative on the City of Toronto Board of Public Health.

As a representative on the Board of Health I will continue to advocate for equitable share of resources to Scarborough, in particular, as it concerns student and family well-being. The Board of Health aims to set public health policies and advises City Council on issues. I am uniquely situated at the Board to provide a student-centered perspective.



Outdoor Education

It is my pleasure to be elected by my fellow trustees to be the TDSB's representative on the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority's Natural Science and Education Committee (NSEC). NSEC is an advisory board that was formed as a result of recommendations from the Outdoor Education Task Force, which I also had the privilege of serving on.

The objective of the NSEC is to advise TRCA Board of Directors on the implementation of the recommendations of the Outdoor Education Task Force, especially in creating curricular standards across TRCA and school boards



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Parents as Partners

Digital Math Tools at the TDSB

The Mathematics Department continues to implement district-wide access to various math tools to improve student math performance. The tools align with the Ontario math curriculum and support students in building foundational math skills and proficiency. Tools include:

- Brainingcamp (available system-wide): Brainingcamp is a suite of 17 powerful virtual math manipulatives.
- Knowledgehook (available system-wide): Knowledgehook is a digital math tool available for learning mathematical concepts and checks for understanding.
- MathUP: MathUP is a professional learning resource that supports differentiated instructional practices.



Looking Forward: Student Nutrition

In the Fall, I will be moving a motion at the Board on student nutrition. The aim of the motion is to get a comprehensive understanding of what services are being provided within our schools as it relates to student nutrition and identify where gaps exist.

The analysis will be able to provide a roadmap for how to address issues of student nutrition in our schools. We hope to build private-public partnerships to address student nutrition. The aim is to lay the groundwork for a more sustained nationally funded student nutrition program.

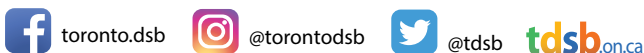
