> Pierre Laporte MS currently serves approximately 310 students in a multiracial, multicultural environment. We are a regional centre for students in Gifted and Behavioural programs. As well, we welcome approximately 25 students a year into our English as a Second Language program.

Literacy

Our overall reading scores improved last year from 66% - 79% of students achieving level 3 and 4 - that is an improvement of 13%. Our writing scores also improved last year from 62% - 76% at level 3 and 4 - that is an improvement of 14%. By the end of 2011-2012 we would like to see our literacy achievement increase by 10% with a focus on narrowing the gap between genders.

Numeracy

52% of our grade 6 students are achieving level 3 and 4 in EQAO. We would like to see our student performance in Grade 6 Math improve by 10%, increasing their achievement level to 62%. Based on report card data, we would like to see our students increase their achievement by 5% in all math strands.

Pathways

At Pierre Laporte we are focussing on students who are achieving Level 2 or below and determining which supports are needed. We are doing this by looking at the following data: Report Card Data, At-Risk Forms, Attendance, CASI scores, IST Referrals, EQAO, Data Walls, Guidance Referrals and Office Referrals.

Community, Caring and Culture

In order to support our students' emotional and social needs, community and staff have come together to deliver various programs. Some examples include Pride in Action, Student Ambassadors, office helpers, morning announcers and various sports activities. Staff also help to plan special events including literacy days, math nights and other parent information sessions.

What Sets Us Apart


