Moreover, that change is made to remove the word "traditional lands" to "ancestral lands".

- If we are going to talk about territory or tradition territory we need to have an understanding of what it means. It is really about an Indigenous paradigm of land, the storied paradigm.

Blu:

• Did not want this issue to be deferred as we often get caught up in this.

Lena:

 Just acknowledging that this land acknowledgement is going to be changing. That is why Anishinaabe people did not write things down. Everybody's land acknowledgement is different. The TKaronto meeting place-Williams



treaty, what about the wampum belts? What about the dish with one spoon. It will be consistently changing.

Mike Izzo:

 Offers a staff perspective and agrees that everything is changing and to make a motion to change the wording would involve reprinting and distribution to all 588 TDSB schools. It is a massive amount of work to make a shift.

 Right now the acknowledgment is misleading and right now it has to be addressed. It is just a small change.

Joseph:

 I'm concerned what effect is this going to have on Métis children who attend the new school.

 I think we can leave this to the AEC and allow them to make the adjustments respecting the wishes of the Métis Council.
