School on the Move

In June 2008, the Ministry of Education accorded Humberwood Downs the recognition of being a SCHOOL ON THE MOVE, one of 40 schools chosen in the Province of Ontario. This was a result of incremental improvement in testing scores, teacher growth, distributed leadership, and engaged staff, parents and students.

Humberwood Downs Junior Middle Academy is located at the edge of the Humber Arboretum on the east side of Humberwood Boulevard in north Etobicoke. The school was opened in partnership with the Toronto Catholic District School Board, the Toronto Public Library and Toronto Parks, Forestry and Recreation in 1996.

- The school serves approximately 1100 students representing almost 50 different language groups.
- Humberwood Downs shares a school yard, gymnasiums, resource centre, unified arts, music, science lab with our site partner, Holy Child Catholic School.
- The school grounds are designed and operated as an extension of the Humber Arboretum and on-site activities respect and preserve the natural balance of this environment.

The Humberwood Centre

Humberwood Downs is one partner of the unique Humberwood Centre. Other partners include Holy Child Catholic School, Etobicoke Public Library, and Toronto Parks, Forestry, and Recreation. Facilities include the Macaulay Child Development Centre, Music rooms, an Art studio, Design and Technology room and Family studies rooms for grades 6-8 students. The centre is 292,000 square feet of learning for students, staff, and parents!






Speech Competition - Listen to the Children

Promethean Comes to Humberwood!

In the spring of 2010, we learned of a new technology called Promethean boards and their many interactive features. August 2010 saw 8 teachers receiving 3 full days of professional development on our 5 newly-purchased Promethean boards. Teachers are growing in their use of the boards and student engagement in learning is very high.



Girl's Respect Program

The Girl's Respect Program is in its 2nd year. Grade 7 and 8 girls meet each Friday after school to study a book on self-respect and discuss real-life situations that they face. Last year they had an overnight conference featuring dinner, workshops, and team building exercises. This year the program has added a mentoring component for girls in grades 3-5.



Chess - Getting Better One Move at a Time

Humberwood Downs boasts 2 chess teams. The Juniors are led by Mr. Ennis and the Intermediates by Mr. Bakker. At the Spring 2010 Finals, the Juniors won the Family of Schools trophy. The Intermediates challenged a secondary school and won! Now two trophies grace our showcase! This year our plan includes professional chess instruction for our Chess Club members.
