Mathematics and the Sciences

With access to a wide range of courses, our students meet high academic standards in the areas of Mathematics and the Sciences and also successfully compete in national and international contests. Our Grade



12 math team placed second in Canada at the University of Waterloo Euclid Mathematics Contest, and consistently places in the top 20 schools. Students also participate in the American Invitational Math Exam, the American Math Competition and the Canadian Mathematics Olympiad. Our students achieve high scores on the Avogadro Chemistry Exam, the Chem 13 Exam and the University of Toronto Biology Competition.

Jarvis students flourish with the rich offering of English courses that build a solid foundation of literacy skills as well as provide exposure to world literature.
