Staff Update – Karen Falconer	<ul> <li>Karen provided an update on questions that were asked at the last meeting:         <ul> <li>Membership of the BSACAC – Michelle Munroe was unable to attend the meeting this evening however, the following information was provided by Michelle in response to the questions posed:</li> <li>Question: Should members represent an organization/institution alliance etc.?</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
	Answer: According to the Terms of Reference for BSACAC Membership will entail a central advisory body representing a wide range of service institutions and community organizations. Up to ten (10) organizations, institutions and alliances representing the following strategic areas: Education/Guidance, Social Service/CAS, Legal, Corrections, Communication/Media, Systemic/organizational/institutional Change, Police, Community, Arts and Health/Mental Health.	
	It can be interpreted that members should be representing organizations, institutions and alliances across the 10 strategic areas although it is not clear. It would have been clearer if it stated: "Individuals representing organizations from the following strategic areas".	
	Question: Can a member whose term has ended (served 2 years as outline in the Terms of Reference be continued?	
	Answer: The Terms of Reference states "organizations representing the 10 priority areas will serve a 2 year renewable term". This means that members can sit for 2 years and submit an Expression of Interest if they wish to renew membership or serve another 2 year term. If an Expression of Interest form was not submitted, then the member's term has ended.	

	<ul> <li>There was a question if the funds that were spent on Black History month may be tracked and shared with the BSACAC? The funds that are spent by the Board's Heritage Committee is trackable but to get the dollar amount on how much schools have spent on Black History, at present this is not tracked, as the funds are not spent just for a month, it would include everything done throughout the year (i.e. guest speakers, conferences, etc)</li> <li>There was a request to provide a report on the Human Rights office and hiring. Remi Warner was hired as the Senior Manager for the Human Rights Office and he has volunteered to attend the April 1st BSACAC meeting if the committee so wishes. Confirmed that Remi be invited to attend the April 1st meeting.</li> <li>BSACAC Recommendations and Board decisions. Everyone received a copy of all the recommendations that were submitted to the Program and Schools Services Committee from March 6th, 2017 until now with the Board's Decisions. Everyone received 5-pages from the Multi-Years Strategic Plan (pages 29-33) that directly addresses Black Student Achievement and Well-Being. These commitments hold the Board and staff to account. Discussion continued on how would these goals be tracked and measured; how they will be achieved; funding; are there community partners; etc. Associate Director Colleen Russell-Rawlins will be attending the April 1st meeting and will be able to provide further information with regards to the Multi-Years Strategic Plan.</li> <li>The African Diaspora Youth Conference is coming up in May 2019. Caring and Safe Schools Update – Jim Spyropoulos	<ul> <li>Jim is the Executive Superintendent for Human Rights and Indigenous Education; Caring and Safe Schools falls under this portfolio.</li> <li>Currently the Caring and Safe Schools Policy 051 is under review. There are a series of steps in revising the policy. Community Advisory Committees Co-Chairs were contacted on January 21<sup>st</sup> regarding a meeting that would be held for advisory committees to provide feedback to the policy. The meeting is open to members of Advisory Committees who will be representing their specific Advisory Committees. However, guests may also attend. Additionally, the policy is posted on line for anyone wishing to provide feedback in this way. A meeting date of February 27<sup>th</sup> was to be held but due to the winter storm, the meeting was cancelled. A new date has not been scheduled as yet. A request was made to Jim to invite the following people from outside the Board to be included in the consultation process: A.B.L.E., BISN Bonnie or Stacey Clark, Deputy Minister of Corrections David Mitchell, Justice Michael Pollock, Donald Mcleod, Sharon Mcleod from Ryerson University and Roy McMurtry. A request was made to have a copy of the revised policy provided to the BSACAC committee before it goes to the Board for approval.
