	Finance Budget and Enrolment The board has decided to not proceed to convert the board's extended day program to a licensed childcare program as required to be eligible for Canada -Wide Early Learning and Child Care (CWELCC) program.		
Senior Staff Update	 Caring and safe schools Phase 1 was developed with inputs from students, school staff and trustees and it was identified that there is a need for the presence of more caring adults such as school advisors, child and youth workers, counselors, social workers, and school-based safety monitors in schools. Expert reference group to be formed with community partners, representatives from Toronto Public Health, City of Toronto, staff, students, PIAC and SEAC. Staff working with city of Toronto, in the safe TO initiatives, Toronto Police and other organizations to keep schools safe. Use of data and technology and modern video surveillance will installed in every school for student safety. TDSB Budget Process 2023-2024 The budget memorandum was distributed to the committee on January 10, 2023. Staff presented the timeline of the budget submission to the

	 Special Interest Program Staff presented student interest programs that are available in TDSB, the summary of student applicant data and the application process. Self-Identification is done on a voluntary basis to guide, identify and serve those who are historically underserved communities as identified in the TDSB data. 		
PCEO Update	A written report was distributed to the committee.		
Q& A	Parent Consultations Full year school changed to semester program school without consultation with parents. How did the Board make the decisions for all secondary school to be semester program? The decision was based on the learning from the pandemic, semester programing enabled students to access to programs that full year students didn't have access to and easier for students to transition. Students who wish to switch between school or go virtual is an option available with semester program. The current procedure is under review by staff and parent consultation will be done.		
	Sports program Engaging students in athletics specifically secondary students, is there an enhanced athletics program		

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	for secondary students? Staff should work on student engagement and provide the resources to students; consultative approach should be done with students. Safe and caring schools planning reports be available for parents? The report will be available to the public. Course Selection How do students apply to collaborative course selection across the board?		
	Students are asked to look for the courses as listed by the Ministry of Education for the next year and based on the numbers received for a particular course staff would create strategies to have the course provided to the students.		
	Special Needs Students Why is special needs schools and Indigenous schools not part of the special Interest program schools? Our First Nations, Metis and Inuit students are included as one of the 4 groups that can self identify for the program selection process. As per the Human Rights Commission looking at system wide data and the data from within programs, the data was not available to support special needs students. The census data 2023 can help to determine the needs and to change the demographic needs of the program.		
	Mental Health Supports for students Highlighted the work of community cultural partners such as Naseeha and recommended for the board to		

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	partner with similar community cultural partners. Extracurricular Are there any incentives for the teachers for extracurricular initiatives? The board is working on positive school culture and not by incentives. Concerns on privacy regarding video surveillance Cameras already exist in all schools; the changes are to the quality of the video that is being captured for safety of students in schools. Wait list for programs in schools What about the waiting list and empty seats? The deadlines for secondary programs to continue until February 22 nd and the elementary program will be offered until March the 22 nd . Why can't home school students who are on the waitlist be offered if the program? Staff will look at the feedback for consideration. Arts Speciality programs Why is the curriculum for the arts being changed to general arts? Staff are looking to be more flexible in programs and student interests, the decisions is driven by student voice and how engaged the students are. Safety issues in schools and neighbourhoods Has staff done any research on based on neighbourhoods Has staff done any research on based on neighbourhoods where students from certain middle schools are not able attend certain high schools? Staff is aware and is working on making accommodations for students.
