## Black Student Summer Leadership Program

The Centre of Excellence for Black Student Achievement is engaging in the second year of the Black Student Summer Leadership Program (BSSLP). In this program, staff from the TDSB partner with participating organizations to match self-identifying Black TDSB students with experiential learning opportunities. This program will support students in developing their social and professional networks, transferable skills and in the long-term increase the visibility of individuals identifying as Black in careers in which they may be underrepresented.

Through this program, for-profit and not-for-profit organizations provide one-of-a-kind learning and employment experiences to secondary school students and introduce them to a wide variety of professional pathways. Students engaged in this program are paid for their contributions.

## Faculty of Engineering Secondary School – spots available

The Centre of Excellence for Black Student Achievement and the Faculty of Engineering Secondary School at the University of Ottawa offers high school students the opportunity to take courses with the University of Ottawa while gaining credits toward their Ontario Secondary School diploma.

Students registered through the Centre of Excellence for Black Student Achievement and the Toronto District School Board will not have to pay to attend this program or for any of the course materials. Funding has been provided by the Education Equity Secretariat at the Ontario Ministry of Education.

Students from Grades 8 to 12 are eligible to apply. Students in Grade 8 require a letter of recommendation from their principal.

The courses offered to TDSB students this year are Exploring Technological Design (TDJ10) and Creative Computing: Introduction to Computer Studies (ICS20).
