Rooms Available for Potential
Partnership

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The schools identified on the list of candidate sites below represent opportunities where infrastructure that is not required for the accommodation of students within the next three to five years may be shared with community partners. If an interest in a particular site below is expressed, then a site investigation will proceed to determine many of the specific details related to the proposed partnership including the exact number and location of rooms within the school that could be made available, and the compatibility/suitability of the potential partner. Note that any lease arrangement with an external group or agency is subject to approval by the Board of Trustees. Leases will be for a minimum of one year and may be terminated with six months' notice. The exercise to identify candidate sites is undertaken annually in order to incorporate changes in demographics, enrolment or outcomes of active/planned accommodation studies.

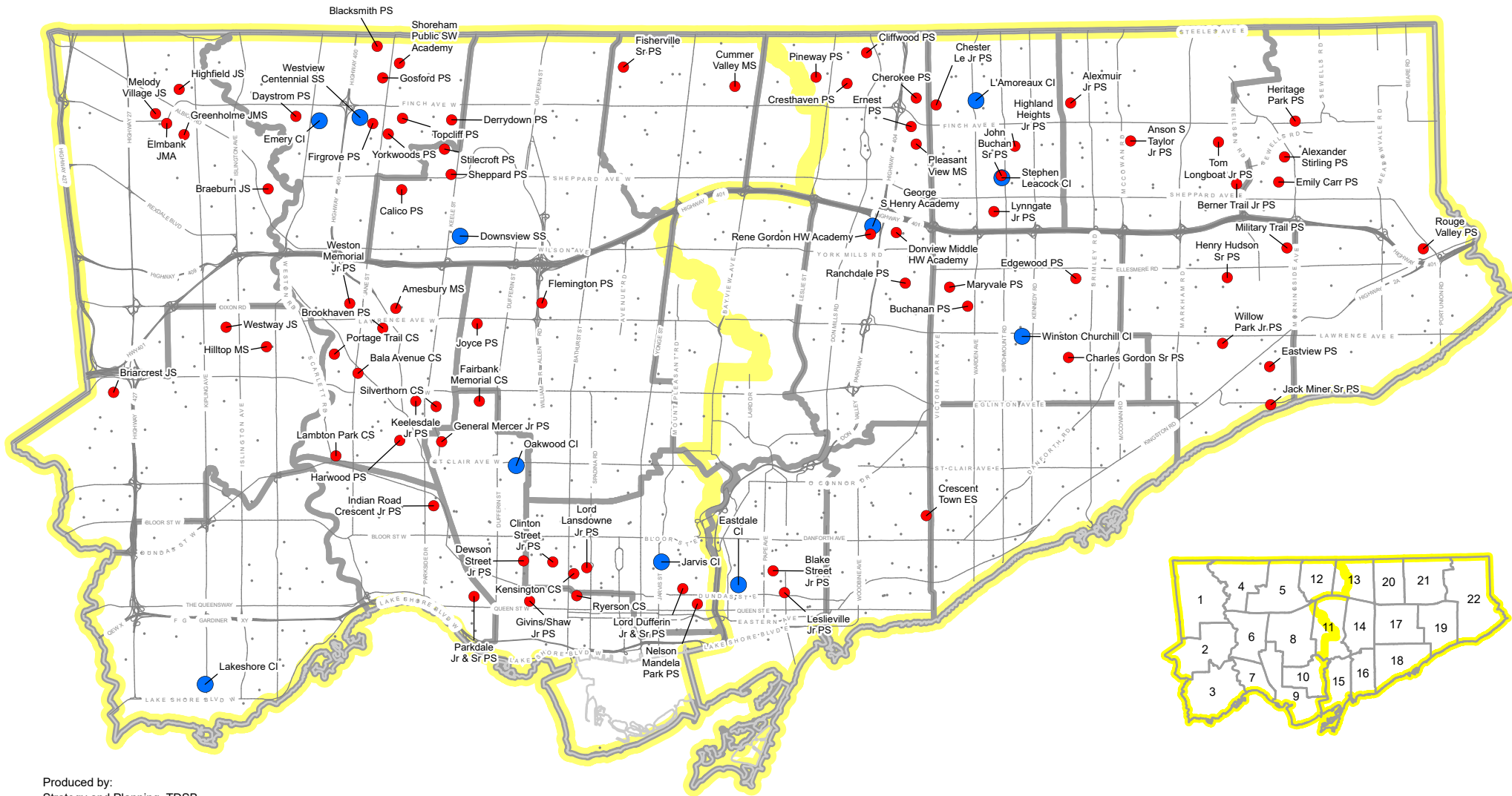

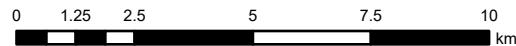
