GENERAL OVERVIEW

*Candidates must be available to work 3-5 days per week
Up to 6 hours per day*

This position requires travel between TDSB sites on a regular basis.

Candidates must be able to work additional hours as appropriate for selected activities including school based and system wide events and rehearsals, and provide after-school workshops for teachers.

Bring your expertise to work with classroom teachers in K-6 and Junior Division in our music staff development program. The Itinerant Music Instructor, Orff, Recorder and Vocal focuses on building the classroom teacher's knowledge about music and capacity to teach music; and enhances and improves music experiences and learning in the classroom.

Instruction is through demonstrating Orff or Recorder or Vocal music lessons and team teaching with the classroom teacher.

Among the key duties, the Instructor reviews and plans with teachers; selects and provides suitable resources; makes minor repairs to instruments and maintains inventory; and schedules and/or timetable activities.

- Two years' related experience instructing Orff or Recorder or Vocal music in an educational environment
- Orff Specialist certification or deemed equivalent OR
- The ability to instruct and demonstrate on the Recorder family of instruments OR
- Working knowledge of the Ontario Music Curriculum; knowledge of music education philosophies and child development learning psychologies
- Kodaly Specialist certification, knowledge of adult learning styles, experience teaching music to children
- Choral Music Education, piano proficiency, experience in conducting techniques
