	Discussion Do all schools have website? All schools can have access to a website and the Board's web team can support schools for setting their school website. Some schools don't have website and the decision not to was made by the staff or school council.		
	Does the board track active and non-active school websites? It varies from school to school and depends on the staff who update the websites. Which staff are supposed to support the school website? Principal or Vice principal or other staff assigned by the principal support the website and it differs from school to school.		
	IT Update Staff reported on the status as per PIAC's recommendations to the Board

	Staff reported on the activation of shared email accounts for school councils 2020-2021- Elementary 104 Secondary - 19 2021-2022 Elementary 138 Secondary 29		

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	Inactive accounts for 2020-2022 Elementary -173 and Secondary - 32 IT backlog issues		
	 Allocation of staff in IT to support school council chair with account issues. PCE office to continue support for community advisory committee accounts. A fulltime staff to be hired to support school council chair & cochair with IT issues, email, outlook, zoom and school messenger issues. The intake process of issuing ticket in the IT portal will be directly done by the principal or vice principal to resolve the issues quickly. A communication outlining the process change to be sent out in April. IT is having systems in place to proactively support school councils every school year. IT to report back to PIAC for 		
	feedback. Discussion		
	Concerns on the IT service level support to school councils were raised. Staff expressed that Board takes service levels seriously and is rated at 89% compliance level to service response in schools. IT staff at the request of PCEO is working by changing the flow		

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	of intake to provide support and service to school councils.		
	COVID update		
	The Board is waiting for ministry direction on the COVID protocols in schools. The Board will share all information and report back to the committee on all operational decisions at the next meeting.		
	Virtual Education Ministry has announced on Feb 17 that all Boards must offer virtual learning for all grades K- 12. Virtual learning is now a model of instruction offered as an option for parents to choose and is not a pandemic response. Switching during the school year		
	is not available for continuity of learning. Classes will be hosted in schools where there is a higher number of kids who have chosen virtual and is based on registration. Secondary virtual school to continue as a central model with		
	courses offered in a central virtual school, which include all the compulsory classes and optional credits. Discussion Can families switch mid-year?		
	No families can choose to go virtual the whole school year.		
	Why is the timeline so tight? is there consideration to give families at least another week given March break in between		

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	and families may want to ask more questions? The timeline is set for March 21 for staffing, to negotiate with our union partners around staffing dates and not delay staffing.		
	Can the families who may need to leave the country can the students continue the course? Staff haven't made those final decisions, yet, but we will be able to share that with families once those decisions are confirmed. Short term accommodations are always done for students in schools pre pandemic or post pandemic.		
	How can parents who choose to be virtual school participate in school councils and graduations?		
	Is there a plan put together to support newcomers and refugees from Ukraine?		
	Staff will continue to support newcomers, refugees by providing specific technical aspects like internet, chrome books integrate them into our learning as quickly as possible to make sure that they are welcomed with open arms.		
	When students can login virtually, do they have to notify the school if they are not in the country? The different time zones could make it difficult for students to		

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	participate in virtual classes. The virtual school choice next year is a choice of model of instruction unlike last year which was a pandemic response. There won't be any exemptions in terms of attending classes in virtual learning.		
	How will the Board manage the attendance for families in virtual school where students are attending classes outside the country and for families in brick and mortar that may need to travel will have attendance issues? Attendance is monitored in virtual classes, the expectation is that students are attending classes like students who were attending in bricks and mortar. Staff have accommodated family emergencies that require families to travel.		
	The timelines on virtual school is very short and PIAC requested to staff for multiple reminder communications be sent to parents.		
	 Staff Update. The motion on anti-racism will be reported under the Director's report in April Ontario Human Rights commission's right to read report will be presented in April School year Calendar -Staff response to September 6 PA day was to support and align with the co-terminus TCDSB board has been passed at this time.

Q& A	School Council Outreach Why are there 24 schools with no active school councils? Staff reported that the reasons for inactive schools vary, some schools have no parents/caregivers to form a school council, some schools have very few parents/caregivers who are willing but not sufficient to form a full school council. Staff are working on engaging strategies to track and monitor and provide support to schools to form school councils. Request to staff to provide the list of schools by ward. PIAC ward co-reps can provide support schools to have school councils. Can Superintendents be involved to work with schools that don't have councils?

New Business	School year Calendar		Motion by Andrew W (Co-Chair) and

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	• TDSB revised the 2022-2023 School Year Calendar on February 24, 2022 so that September 6, 2022, the Tuesday after Labor Day is now a Professional Development (PD) Day and students' first day of classes is Wednesday, September 7, 2022. • The change was made without consultation through the School Year Calendar Committee where stakeholders including PIAC members sit representing parents/caregivers. Staff responded that historically PD day would be allocated between the Tuesday of the Labor Day weekend and the end of June when there are up to 194 days available for the school year. This practice aligns with the Toronto Catholic District School Board school year and for busing purposes. The motion was discussed by PIAC members, staff and trustee and the decision was to take a recorded vote on the motion.		2nd by Janice B (W11) Therefore, be it resolved that the PIAC recommends the following actions to Director of Education and the Board: The School Year Calendar Committee reconvene to consider the concerns raised regarding the impact of the scheduled PD Day on parents and families, and to consider viable alternatives. Ensure that the School Year Calendar Committee address the placement of PD Days on the calendar going forward; and If the PD Day on Tuesday, September 6 is to remain, that immediate, transparent, and clear communication be sent out to parents/caregivers, so they have as much time as
