	reteaching of the concepts from the		
	remote learning and the need for		
	additional support for positive and		
	confident learning.		
	Graduation		
	What is the status or direction of the		
	Board on graduation? Especially for		
	Gr.8 to High School, for the university		
	or post-secondary bound students		
	Graduations have not happened due		
	to the pandemic and the		
	requirements around physical		
	distancing and the school closures.		
	Principals to work with staff, students		
	and parents to decide what is feasible		
	to mark the transitions locally. It		
	varies from school to school, parents		
	can contact the local superintendent		
	to have a discussion and share		
	concerns.
