Re: Report to PIAC Meeting

Nutrition Program Federal Funding

The Government of Canada and Province of Ontario <u>announced an investment in Student Nutrition Programs in the</u> <u>Ontario</u> today. Ontario has reached an agreement with the federal government that will see \$108.5 million over three years to help fund a school food program in the province.

The Province is committed to flowing some of this money this school year. TFSS' preliminary understanding is that the amount for the TDSB this school year will be modest, but this number has yet to be confirmed.

In the 2024/2025 school year approximately \$34 million of the federal funding will flow to Ontario and it is estimated 40% will be allocated to the First Nations Student Nutrition Program.

The funding in Ontario will flow through 14 lead agencies and Indigenous partners who administer existing provincial school food programs, such as the Student Nutrition Program and the First Nations Student Nutrition Program. The TFSS is the Lead Agency for Toronto.

The Province has indicated that the initial priority will be strengthening existing nutrition programs (particularly those seeing increased demand or at risk of closing, etc.).
