THE FLAG

- The Somali flag is blue, with a white star.
- The blue colour symbolizes the Indian ocean and the star is a symbol of unity.



The five points represent the 5 regions Somalis reside.

- 1. Djibouti
- 2. Somaliland (formerly British Somali Land)
- Ogaden Region (Northern Ethiopia)
- 4. The "South" (formerly Italian Somali Land)
- 5. North East Kenya

OVERVIEW


- The official languages are Somali and Arabic.




Traditional Somali Architecture

- Triangular shape with brick facade
- 15 m tower & exterior walls remain

Benadir Regional Administration

- 2 story regional building
- Held administrative arm of government
- Moorish arches (neoclassical wings)


