## **SEPTEMBER 2024** Family Literacy Calendar











# **Tuesday 3**Help your child practice writing their name. Say all the letter names.

#### Wednesday 4

Explore the outdoors.
Name three things that can fly, three things that can crawl, and three things that grow outside.

#### **Thursday 5**

Look at a flyer. Talk about some pictures that start with the same sound (e.g., /c/ - corn, can)

#### Friday 6

Talk about the first week of school. Ask your child to tell you what brought them joy.

#### **Monday 9**

Make up sentences with weather words (e.g. sunny, windy, cloudy) and count the words using your fingers.

#### **Tuesday 10**



#### Wednesday 11

Read a story to your child in English and/or your home language. Read to a certain point and ask your child what might happen next.

#### **Thursday 12**

Go for a nature walk and listen and describe what you hear (e.g. bird chirping).

#### Friday 13

Talk about the letters or characters of your home language.

#### **Monday 16**

Look for logos, signs, symbols in your home, on TV, while outside for a walk. Talk about what you notice. For example, colours, shape, etc. Make your own sign.

#### Tuesday 17 Wednesday 18 Place a small item

(e.g. paper clip, crayon) for each word in the sentence, "I like going to school."
Then count the items.

#### **Thursday 19**



#### Friday 20

What can you draw by making only circles, squares, triangles? Label your picture with letters/words.

#### **Monday 23**

The shape of the day is a rectangle. Help your child draw a rectangle. See how many places you can find a rectangle today!

#### **Tuesday 24**

Stories have a problem and a solution. When reading together, help your child discover the problem in the story and how it was solved.

#### **Wednesday 25**



#### **Thursday 26**

Ask your child to tell you three things they did in school today.

#### Friday 27

Talk with your child about traditional dishes from your home country.

#### **Monday 30**

Point out words that begin with the same letter as your child's name (e.g. Aamir - apple). With your child, talk about how the beginning sounds are alike.









## OCTOBER 2024 Family Literacy Calendar











#### **Tuesday 1**

Make up short sentences with your child. Say them again and leave out a word. Have your child say the missing word.

#### Wednesday 2

What is the first sound in your name?

#### **Thursday 3**

**FALL!** How many words can you think of that rhyme with fall?

#### Friday 4

Have your child tell someone in your family a funny story.

#### **Monday 7**

Using magnetic letters or letters written on paper, show your child the letters in their name. Have your child practice rearranging the letters to spell their name.

#### **Tuesday 8**

Name five animals. Hop for each syllable. Include words in your home language.

#### **Wednesday 9**



#### **Thursday 10**

Help your child understand sequence by giving them everyday examples, such as a morning routine: (e.g. First, I wake up. Next, I get dressed. Then, I eat breakfast.)



#### **Monday 14**

During dinner, describe the flavours of the meal (e.g. sour, spicy, sweet).

#### **Tuesday 15**

With your child, collect a bag of items from outside and sort them by something they have in common.

#### **Wednesday 16**



#### **Thursday 17**

Have your child draw/write about their favourite part of a story and share it with someone else.

#### Friday 18



#### **Monday 21**

Point out feelings using family pictures. With your child, take the opportunity to talk about emotions that family members are feeling.

#### **Tuesday 22**



#### Wednesday 23

Go on a scavenger hunt for numbers in your home or community. Try to find numbers shown in different ways. Take pictures and talk about numbers you found.

#### **Thursday 24**



#### Friday 25

Think of three friends. What sounds do their names start with?

#### **Monday 28**

Think of five fall words (e.g. leaf, wind). Talk about the first and last sounds of the words.

#### Tuesday 29

Texture Hunt: Find items that feel different in your home. Can you find items that are soft, hard, rough, bumpy? How would you describe their texture?

#### Wednesday 30

As you are reading a story with your child, ask questions to decide if a story is a fantasy or fiction. Could that happen in real life? How do you know?

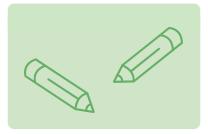














Friday 1
With your child, go for a fall nature walk. Find five leaves and talk about what is similar and different about them.

#### **Monday 4**

With your child, make up sentences using different words (e.g., table, book, school). Include your home language.

#### **Tuesday 5**

Read a story with your child. Discuss the pictures and how they tell the story.

#### Wednesday 6

Using magnetic letters or letters written on paper, take the letters in your child's name, mix them up and have them place them in order. Play several times.

#### **Thursday 7**

Ask your child to put words together to make new words: rain + coat pine + cone scare + crow apple + sauce



#### **Monday 11**

With a favourite book, discuss book concepts such as the author, illustrator, front/back page.

#### **Tuesday 12**

Help your child teach someone else how to make a triangle. What do you do first? Next? Last?

#### **Wednesday 13**



#### **Thursday 14**

Make up a sentence using fall words (e.g.,tree, leaves, rake). Count the words in each sentence.

#### Friday 15

Help your child describe directions for making a snack. Ask, "What comes first? What happens next?"

#### **Monday 18**

Play the restaurant game and have your child create a menu and write your food order.

#### **Tuesday 19**



#### Wednesday 20

Together brainstorm toys and games that have the /c/ sound (as in cards). Write the words and read the list together.

#### **Thursday 21**

Hopping words! Take a sentence from a favourite story and have your child hop for each word.

#### Friday 22



#### **Monday 25**

Help set the table and say the first sound of each item placed.

#### **Tuesday 26**

Hide magnetic letters or letters written on paper around the room. Have your child tell you the letters as they find them.

#### Wednesday 27

Play a board game that involves counting.

#### **Thursday 28**



#### Friday 29

Have your child help you write a shopping list.

#### **DECEMBER 2024** Family Literacy Calendar









#### **Monday 2**

Clap out the syllables in the word "De-cem-ber".

#### **Tuesday 3**

What kind of foods would you likely eat on a cold winter day? Have your child explain why.

#### **Wednesday 4**

Help your child tell a story about a picture or photo.

#### **Thursday 5**

Stomp like an elephant for each word in a sentence about an animal.

#### Friday 6

Go on a scavenger hunt to find items that begin with the same sound (e.g., "d" – dog, dinner).

#### **Monday 9**

What sound do you hear in the middle of: cat, sat, mat? Name three other words with the same middle sound.

#### **Tuesday 10**

Take turns playing "Find a...." (s, t, w, etc.) when reading a book together.

#### **Wednesday 11**

#### **Thursday 12**



#### Friday 13

Have your child practice writing their name, starting with an uppercase letter, followed by lowercase letters.

#### **Monday 16**

With a larger group, act out addition and subtraction problems. (e.g. 5 people are here now, but 2 have to leave.)

#### **Tuesday 17**

Have your child create a card for someone and write their name at the bottom.

#### **Wednesday 18**

Pick a sound (such as /p/) and have your child create a collage by cutting out pictures that begin/end with the sound.

#### Friday 20

Make a list of holiday activities that you'd like to plan.

## JANUARY 2025 Family Literacy Calendar













#### Wednesday 1

Read a book together. Find five words that have three syllables. Say the words slowly to hear all the syllables. (e.g. fes-ti-val; car-ni-val)

#### Thursday 2

Talk about the punctuation marks(e.g., periods, commas, question marks) in a book.



#### **Monday 6**



#### **Tuesday 7**

Have your child think of words that have the /s/ sounds at the end? (e.g., grass, bus, dress, etc.)

#### **Wednesday 8**



#### **Thursday 9**

Use "robot talk" to say words with three to five sounds. Have your child listen to the separated sounds and put them together.(e.g., you say, /c//a//t/, child says "cat").

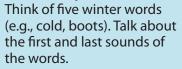
#### Friday 10

During meal time, make the sound each food item begins with. (e.g. you're going to eat something that starts with /b/ sound "beans"). Repeat the task with another food.

#### **Monday 13**

Read a story with your child, and spend time finding ways the characters are alike and how they are different.

#### Wednesday 15



#### **Thursday 16**

Say the names of all family members. Use your voice to emphasize the first sound in each name.

#### Friday 17

Play with blocks or legos. How many ways can your child make five with two colours of legos? (e.g., one red and four blue).

#### **Monday 20**

Give sound clues so your child can guess an item in the room (e.g., It is red, round and begins with the sound /a/).

#### **Tuesday 21**

**Tuesday 14** 

Ask your child to tell you three things they did in school today.

#### Wednesday 22



#### **Thursday 23**

Have your child pick his/her favourite number. Look for that number throughout the day, draw a picture of that number of things, or sing a song that many times.

#### **Monday 27**

Have your child match uppercase letters to lowercase letters.

#### **Tuesday 28**

Singing rhyming songs can be a fun way to play with speech sounds (e.g., Itsy Bitsy Spider). Sing songs in your home language.

#### **Wednesday 29**

Before reading together, talk with your child about what they already know about the topic.

#### Thursday 30

Have your child use their imagination to create a story. They can act out and/ or tell you their story using objects found in your home.

### **FEBRUARY 2025**Family Literacy Calendar









#### **Monday 3**

Say ten alphabet sounds. Have your child write the letter for each of the sounds.

#### **Tuesday 4**

Ask your child to put words together to make new words: snow + suit winter + time fire + place snow + storm

#### **Wednesday 5**

Have your child practice asking questions. They can use the words "How,", "What", "When", "Why" and "Where".

#### **Thursday 6**

Have your child tap out the syllables of the items that you are packing into your child's backpack (e.g., paper, book).

#### Friday 7

Help your child write/draw about their favourite thing to do in the winter.

#### **Monday 10**

Read a story to your child and ask questions about sequence. What happened first? How do you know? What happened last?

#### **Tuesday 11**

What is the last sound in your name?

#### **Wednesday 12**



#### **Thursday 13**

Play a guessing game to give your child practice matching letters and sounds. (e.g. "I'm thinking of something that starts with the sound /t/.")

#### Friday 14

Go on a sound hunt for things that start with the /b/ (e.g. bird, bark, bench). Pick another letter and look for objects that start with that sound.

#### **Monday 17**

Talk about the print in the book. Can you find two words that are the same?

#### **Tuesday 18**



#### **Wednesday 19**

Say five words starting with "s". Show your child "S", ask what sound it makes. Play a game where they sit, you read a list of words and if they start with "s" your child jumps up.

#### **Thursday 20**



#### Friday 21

Create movements based on different feelings. Ask your child how to move if they were sad, happy, upset, angry, excited, scared, nervous, sick, tired.

#### **Monday 24**

Take turns picking a number up to ten and practice counting down to zero from it. Repeat this with different numbers.

#### **Tuesday 25**

Invite your child to call a friend or relative. Support them to ask these two questions:

- 1) How are you?
- 2) What did you do today?

#### **Wednesday 26**

Have your child draw/write about their favourite part of a story and share it with someone else.

#### **Thursday 27**

Keep playing with how words sound. Ask your child what other words rhyme with "in" (e.g., in/fin).

#### Friday 28

Read a book to your child. Ask them to draw a picture of where the story took place (sometimes called "the setting").











# MARCH 2025 Family Literacy Calendar









#### **Monday 3**

Find an 'asking' sentence (question) in a book.

#### **Tuesday 4**

Clap the syllables in five of your favourite foods (e.g.,pizza=2, banana=3, soup=1, salad=2).

#### **Wednesday 5**

Ask your child what their favourite animal is. Help them write/draw a list of all the things they know about that animal.

#### **Thursday 6**



#### Friday 7

Read a familiar story and talk about why the characters did the things they did.

#### **Monday 10**

Show your child different types of print. Read signs, billboards, recipes, labels and schedules.

#### **Tuesday 11**



#### **Wednesday 12**

Read different versions of the same book and compare the stories. What is the same? What is different?

#### **Thursday 13**



#### Friday 14

Have your child pick one thing they did this week and write/draw a story about it.

#### **Monday 17**

Have your child roll a die and tell you the number. Ask what is one more than your number? Have them roll again and ask what is two more than your number.

#### **Wednesday 19**

Take away the middle sound in **BAG** and replace it with /e/, /i/, /o/ and /u/. What are the new words?

#### **Thursday 20**

Name five food items that you eat. Hop for each syllable. Include words in your home language.

#### Friday 21

**SPRING!** How many words can you think of that rhyme with spring?

#### **Monday 24**

Place a 3D shape in a bag. Ask your child to reach into the bag to feel the shape and describe it without looking at it. You can use a ball, a cereal box, tube, etc.

#### **Tuesday 25**

**Tuesday 18** 

Write the names of items in your house on post-it notes and stick them on the correct item (e.g., table).

#### **Wednesday 26**

Play "I Spy." Say, "I spy something with these sounds, /d/, /o/, /g/." Child says "dog". Take turns with your child.

#### **Thursday 27**

Use magnetic letters or letters written on paper to form short words such as: cat, sun, tub, etc.

#### Friday 28

Ask your child which of your toys is the heaviest? How do you know? Which of your toys is the longest? How long is it? Line your toys up by size.

#### **Monday 31**

With your child, talk about a time when you went somewhere special as a family. Help them write/ draw a story about it.









#### **APRIL 2025** Family Literacy Calendar











#### **Tuesday 1**

Give your child a word before reading. When they hear the word they can clap, hop or make a silly face.

#### Wednesday 2

Clap out the syllables in each family member's name. Whose name has the most syllables?

#### **Thursday 3**

Have your child say five words that begin the same sound as their name.

#### Friday 4

Use three blocks (or any small item) and move one for each of the sounds in the words: top (t-o-p), push (p-u-sh).

#### **Monday 7**

Hide magnetic letters or letters written on paper around the room. Have your child tell you the sounds of the letters as they find them.

#### **Tuesday 8**

Write letters/words with your finger on your child's back and have them guess what you wrote. Have your child do the same to you.

#### **Wednesday 9**

#### **Thursday 10**

Have your child tell a story about a time when they were really surprised or excited.

#### Friday 11

Name five things you do outside. What is the last sound you hear (e.g., skip-/p/, bike-/k/)?

#### **Monday 14**



#### **Tuesday 15**

While at the store, help your child find three items with the same beginning or end sound.

#### **Wednesday 16**

Name as many words as possible that begin with the sound /f/.

#### **Thursday 17**



#### Friday 18

Play with blocks! Which blocks stack? Which roll? Which slide? Have your child sort the blocks by shape and count the number in each group.

#### Monday 21

"Jump for Sounds." Say a word and have your child jump for each sound in the word while saying the sound (e.g. bat-/b//a//t/-3 jumps).

#### **Tuesday 22**



#### **Wednesday 23**

Have your child write a little note to add as a surprise to someone's lunch bag.

#### **Thursday 24**

Read a story with your child. Discuss the pictures and how they tell the story.

#### Friday 25

Think of five words that have three sounds (e.g., p-o-p) and four sounds (e.g., s-i-t-s).

#### **Monday 28**

Have your child help you write a shopping list.

#### **Tuesday 29**

Together, compare objects in real life using less than or greater than. (e,g. compare the number of windows to the number of doors at home).

#### **Wednesday 30**

Ask your child to put words together to make new words: out + side sun + flower fire + works rain + bow

Play secret word. Slowly sound out a word (e.g., b-u-s, h-ou-se, f-r-o-g) and have your child guess the secret word.

#### Wednesday 21

Have your child draw a picture of their favourite toy. Talk about what makes it so special then write about it.

#### **Thursday 22**

Go on a scavenger hunt to find items that begin with the same sound (e.g., "m" – mat, marker).

#### Friday 23

Play with blocks or legos. How many ways can they make ten with two colours of legos? (e.g. two red and eight blue).

#### **Monday 26**

Find ten things, and order them by size - tallest to smallest.

#### **Tuesday 27**

Sing a rhyming song in your home language.

#### **Wednesday 28**

Help your child read their favourite book and write a new ending.

#### **Thursday 29**

Fill a bucket of water and have your child test if a toy will sink or float. Sort the toys and make a tally of how many sunk and how many floated.

#### Friday 30

Have your child think of words that have the /t/ sound at the end? (e.g., hat, shirt, etc.)

## JUNE 2025 Family Literacy Calendar









#### **Monday 2**

Say fifteen alphabet sounds. Have your child write the letter for each of the sounds.

#### **Tuesday 3**

Play Head/ Shoulders/Knees/ Toes. Say a word and have your child touch their head for 1st sound, shoulders for the 2nd, knees for the 3rd, and toes for the 4th.

#### Wednesday 4

What is a sound in the middle of your name?

#### **Thursday 5**



#### Friday 6

With your child, create a poster of faces with different emotions. Ask them to identify an emotion on the poster and ask when they last felt this way and why.

#### **Monday 9**



#### **Tuesday 10**

Read a story to your child in English and/or your home language. Read to a certain point and ask your child what might happen next.

#### **Wednesday 11**

Help your child count and keep track of how many vegetables and pieces of fruit you eat today. Did you eat more fruit or more vegetables? How many more?

#### **Wednesday 18**

Using familiar words, write simple sentences on paper and cut the sentence into words. Have your child put the words back together to make each sentence.

#### **Thursday 19**

Ask your child to tell you three things they did in school today.

#### Friday 20

Have your child draw a picture of themself and label it (e.g. head, mouth, etc).

#### **Monday 23**

Go on a scavenger hunt for numbers in your home or community. Try to find numbers shown in different ways. Take pictures and talk about numbers you found.

#### **Tuesday 24**

Think of as many bugs as you can and clap out the syllables (e.g., caterpillar, ladybug, ant, cricket, beetle).

#### **Wednesday 25**

Help your child write/draw a thank you note to someone.

#### **Thursday 26**

Have your child sound out the word as you change the beginning sound. (e.g. the word is spring, take away the /s/, what is the word? Child says ring.)

#### Friday 27

Together with your child, make as many words as you can out of the letters:

Make a list of summer activities that you'd like to plan.
