## Student Trustee Isaiah Shafqat - Introduction

- Isaiah has served as the Indigenous Student Trustee for the past three years. He/They is a grade 12 student in Ward 15
- As Student Trustee Isaiah sits on the Board of Trustees and indigenous student voice to the board room
- The <u>Student Trustees</u> represent 235,000 students in the TDSB. Student Trustees are elected every year and are grade 11 & 12 students. They attend <u>Board Committee</u> Meetings, <u>Student Senate</u>, Ward Forums and <u>Community Advisory Committees</u>.

### Guest Speaker: Executive Superintendent Jack Nigro

- Parent involvement is crucial to student success and it is great to see so many out to Ward Forums
- Jack Nigro is the Executive Superintendent for <u>Learning Centre 4 (LC4)</u>, 155 Schools, 63,000 students, 8 Learning Networks (LN) and 6 Wards (3,7,9,10,15,16).
- Superintendents are Senior Staff who ensure the smooth operations of schools on a daily basis and their role differs from that of a Trustee.
- The role of the Trustee is to develop policy for the Board. The Superintendents develop the procedures to implement the policy.

- Tutoring Support for Students
