

It is my great pleasure to share that I have been selected to be the chair of the director search committee for the Board. It was announced in the Spring that our current director has submitted her resignation. We are currently undertaking the process of hiring a new director.

Fun Fact! The Board of Trustees under the Education Act only hires one employee, the Director of Education. The Director of Education is the most senior position in the Board, akin to a CEO in the private sector. The Director of Education oversees a \$3.5 billion budget, 42, 000 employees, and 583 schools! Directors are typically hired every 5 years.

New Program at Mowat CI!

I am proud to share that Mowat CI will be getting a Math, Science, and Technology (MST) Program starting this September. There are only 20 high schools (out of almost 110) across the TDSB to have the program and we are very fortunate to be one of the schools.


As a part of the program students will be required to take 7 mandatory courses. Upon completion of the courses students will receive a MST certification at graduation.

Al and the TDSB

In June the Board of Trustees passed a motion asking the Director of Education to explore the implications of AI on the Board and report back to the trustees during the upcoming school year.

Some of the key asks include:

- implications of AI on student well-being and achievement
- anticipated benefits to AI use by school boards, educators and students
- implications for board policies and procedures
- early perspectives on the emergence of AI as relates to:
 - O connection to curriculum
 - O privacy, data and security
 - O personal safety

Financial Literacy Curriculum

In June the Board of Trustees passed a motion asking the Director of Education to review the current financial literacy implementations within the curriculum.

Key asks of the motion included:

- re-evaluate the existing financial literacy learning modules currently available across all grades to understand their current utilization and effectiveness
- more actively promote and utilize existing financial literacy resources
- present a report to by fall 2024 on methods to enhance the visibility and usage of existing educational resources, including textbooks, online materials and interactive tools, to broaden financial literacy education across all grades





Climate Action at the TDSB

In 2021, the Board established a goal of net-zero greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 2050.

Some of our initiatives so far include:

- Approval for the design and construction of Ontario's first mass timber school right here in Scarborough!
- A 10% reduction in electricity consumption across 40 schools between April and September 2023, for a savings of \$142,763 and a reduction of 892,268 kWh of electricity; equal to the annual consumption of 94 average Ontario households
- TDSB educators were offered diverse professional learning opportunities for teaching about climate and the environment
- Launch of Youth Climate Action Grant program in 2021/22
