  - o There was a brief recap of the renewed 2024-28 MYSP
  - o There is now an operating plan and key performance indicators for the year
  - As part of school improvement planning, school councils will be asked to participate in the development of an Indigenous Education goal
  - There was discussion on how the MYSP relates to school improvement planning, the work of Superintendents supporting schools, and how MYSP Indicators of Success are being tracked.

## Family of Schools

- To support the MYSP, there is a new <u>Learning Centre (LC) and Family of Schools(FOS)</u>

#### Discussion

  - Supporting parent engagement esp. in secondary schools
  - Connecting families of schools

  - Learning: emotional regulation tools and practices
