Trustee Update

1. National School Food Program Announcement

- Ontario has reached an agreement with the federal government to help fund a <u>school</u> food program in the province.
- We are the third province to finalize a deal within the \$1B, five-year federal investment
- \$108.5 million roll out over the next three years
- Positive news given increasing rate of poverty and years of advocacy
- Program details and impact for TDSB to be determined
- The City of Toronto is also exploring expansion of a school nutrition program.

2. Education Funding Consultation & 2025/26 Budget Development

- <u>OPSBA</u> and <u>TDSB</u> submitting input into 2025-26 education funding via the Ministry's Education Funding Consultation and through presentation to the Province's Standing Committee on Finance and Economic Affairs
- Summary of TDSB response:
 - existing funding gaps are having an impact on student achievement, mental health, and overall well-being
 - transparency in funding
 - special education
 - community use of schools
 - student safety and well-being
 - safe and accepting schools
 - mental health supports (staff and student)

- increased support caring and safe school
- curriculum supports and professional development
- absenteeism and well-being
- unfunded stat benefits
- student 1 to 1 device technology
- cybersecurity
- inflation
- ventilation
- 2025-26 budget development schedule in development
- Anticipating public meetings in April (TBC) and more information to support understanding, feedback, and advocacy

- New Math Achievement Action Plan launched last year
- Reports on early indicators of success and challenges related to Ministry of Education's Math Learning Partners initiative.
- Trustee King motion for consideration of additional communication and advocacy passed unanimously
- Chair issued <u>letter to Ministry</u> seeking additional funding in current school year

- Includes creation of community working groups to inform work
- Update on <u>Islamophobia plan(pg 29)</u> will be presented at <u>Planning and Priorities on</u>
 December 4

6. Humberside CI Boundary Change Review

- Review flows out of <u>TDSB Long Term Program and Accommodation Planning</u> to address capacity issues at schools
- Boundary review of small area with shared and split boundaries between
 Humberside Collegiate and Runnymede Collegiate (impacts approx.. 20 families)
- Public meeting was held November 25
- Information available on website
- Feedback can be submitted through the <u>online survey</u>
- Scheduled for report to trustees at <u>February Planning and Priorities Committee</u> meeting where community members can delegate
- If passed, implemented in 2026/27 (current grade 7s)

7. International Baccalaureate (IB) Fee Implementation

- <u>IB is an enriched academic program</u> offered at 5 TDSB schools including <u>Parkdale</u> Collegiate
- In August 2024, Board approved reinstatement of collection of fees
- Staff have communicated new \$3,300 fee over 4 years with financial assistance available for families under \$50K household income
- Staff are considering community feedback and suggestions
